Mr. Mushnik, the owner, and his employees, Seymour and Audrey watch the hours tick slowly and wonder how they can get "outta here."

Mr. Mushnik knows they must close. They are done. Kaput! He declares to Audrey and Seymour that they are closing, now. But Seymour, young and idealistic, asks for a chance to display more exotic plants as a last ditch effort to save the shop. Perhaps they could display the strange little sprig Seymour has been tinkering with in the back room. He has already named it: Audrey II. Hmm?

A customer sees the mysterious, unidentified plant in the window and comes in for a closer look. Soon customers are flocking to the shop. Orders pour in. Phones ring constantly. Agents want Seymour for radio shows and interviews. Audrey II begins to grow, flourish, and at times seem almost human. But, when Audrey II begins to talk, promising fame and fortune in return for a most unusual diet, Seymour realizes the danger that lies ahead.

This show is described as a horror comedy, rock musical, romance. Youngsters will be fascinated by the puppet like animation, while the senior set will recall the sixties as a girl group provides the doo wop tunes. The rest of us will scratch our heads, wondering how they did that thing with the plant!

Jason Atchley directs *Little Shop of Horrors*, assisted by Michelle Terry. The cast has a delightful balance of newcomers and familiar faces. Jonathan Heath plays Seymour, the hapless flower shop employee; his co--worker, Audrey, a pretty blonde with a tacky sense of fashion, is played by first timer, Jordyn Foss. Her boyfriend, the sadistic dentist, is played by Riley Little and Dalyn Pearson is Mr. Mushnik, shop owner. The doo--wop numbers feature Janel Culver, Gabrielle Lewis, and Elliana Masters, backed up by an ensemble of all ages.

School has barely started, but it will soon be time to jump start your Halloween spirit. So, whether you're seeking comedy, sci-fi, rock or romance, Little Shop of Horrors has it all. But we feel we must warn you don't get too close to that plant!

THANK YOU to our Montrose & Western Slope Community for your incredible support on this project! Our two phase project is starting with the exterior @ \$450,000. The summer 2024 interior remodel represents the remainder of our million dollar budget. We have raised \$300,000, Magic Circle has added \$100,000, and we have applied for two capital campaign grants. The DART program awarded us a \$25,000 façade grant, and the City of Montrose is assisting the asphalt patching, concrete sidewalks, curbs and gutters and pavement markings.

The Theatre WILL BE OPEN OCTOBER 6, 2023 for the opening of *Little Shop of Horrors*. The work will not be completed, but we have been guaranteed front door and parking lot access.





Each and every one of these students rose to the challenge, giving three separate performances of 9 short plays! These amazing students did all of this in a single week from auditions day, workshop day and five rehearsals.
